| Military Leaders? | Persia : King Xerxes Greek : Thermistocles, an Athenian politician |
| Strategy? | A prophecy at the Oracle of Delphi told Athenians they would find protection behind "wooden walls." The Greeks lured (fleeing the city) the Persian fleet in a narrow strait where they could fight their ships a few at a time in a sea battle. Once past the strait, many triremes awaited the rest of the Persian fleet. |
| Outcome? | Persia bumed down the city of Athens. Athenians won and Sparta joined from the north to help defeat the Persians. The Persian retreated. |
