

Olympus: Home of the Gods


 The Greeks believed that the gods lived on the top of Mount Olympus.

Cronus-The Ruling Titan

Rhea-Wife of Cronus

Oceanus-the unending stream of water encircling the world

Hyperion-the Titan of light, the father of the sun, the moon, and the dawn.

Prometheus-wisest of the titans

Atlas-fought against Zeus. Zeus punished Atlas by making him hold up the earth for all eternity.

The War...

- Cronus kills his father (Uranus) and becomes supreme Titan
- Cronus and Rhea have children.
- Cronus eats all the children, fearing one of them will grow up and overthrow him as king.
- Rhea tricks Cronus with the sixth Child-Zeus
- 5. Rhea tricks Cronus by giving him a rock wrapped in a baby blanket, allowing Zeus to escape.
- 6. Zeus grows up to be a very strong god
- Zeus goes back to Mt. Olympus, gives Cronus a poisonous drink that makes him vomit up all the children he swallowed.
- 8. Zeus defeats Cronus and becomes ruler of all the gods.



Zeus Bus

- -Ruler of all Gods
- -God of the Sky

Hera

- -Wife of Zeus
- -goddess of marriage and childbirth
- -sacred animal is the peacock





Hades

- lord of the underworld, ruling over the dead.
- Brother of Zeus
- He doesn't allow any of his subjects to leave.
- He is also the god of wealth
- He rarely leaves the underworld
- Did NOT live on Mt. Olympus
- Forced Persephone to marry him.



Poseidon

- God of Sea and protector of all waters.
- His weapon is a trident, which can shake the earth, and shatter any object.
- He is second only to Zeus in power amongst the gods.
- Tried to impress Demeter by making her a beautiful animal—the first Horse.



Hestia

- Sister of Zeus
- Goddess of Hearth (home)
- Turned her place over to Dionysus.



Demeter

- goddess of corn, grain, and the harvest.
- makes the crops grow each year.
- Made Winter and Spring



Ares

- Ares is the son of Zeus and Hera.
- He is the god of war.
- He is considered murderous and bloodstained but, also a coward.




Athena

- goddess of reason, intelligent activity, arts and literature.
- Athena is the daughter of Zeus. She sprang full grown in armor from his forehead, thus has no mother.
- She is the embodiment of wisdom, reason, and purity.
- She was Zeus's favorite child and was allowed to use his weapons including his thunderbolt.
- Her favorite city is Athens.



Apollo

- Apollo is the son of Zeus.
- He is the god of music, playing a golden lyre. The Archer, far shooting with a silver bow and arrows. The god of healing who taught man medicine. The god of light. The god of truth, who can not speak a lie.
- One of Apollo's more important daily tasks is to harness his chariot with four horses and drive the Sun across the sky.



Artemis

- She was goddess of hunting, wild animals, and the moon.
- Artemis is the daughter of Zeus and Apollo's twin.
- She is the huntsman of the gods and animals feared her.



Hephaestus

- Hephaestus is the son of Zeus and Hera. Sometimes it is said that Hera alone produced him and that he has no father.
- He is the only god to be physically ugly.
- He is lame. (Can not walk)
- He is the god of fire and the forge.
- He is the smith and armorer of the gods. He uses a volcano as his forge.
- He is kind and peace loving and married to Aphrodite.



Hermes

- He was the cleverest of the Olympian gods, and messenger to all the other gods.
- He is Zeus messenger.
- He is the fastest of the gods.
- He wears winged sandals, a winged hat, and carries a magic wand.




Aphrodite

- Dionysus was a Greek god and one of the Twelve Olympians who lived on Mount Olympus.
- He was the god of wine, which was a very important part of the culture of ancient Greece.
- He was the only Olympic god that had one parent that was a mortal (his mother Semele).
