


HOMINID

Early humans who <u>hunt</u> animals and <u>gather</u> wild plants, seeds, fruits, and nuts to survive.





Known as the <u>new</u> stone age. Early humans stopped moving and started farming








A time of <u>climate change</u> when huge ice glaciers covered the Earth's surface allowing the early humans to travel over the frozen water to new land.

A <u>scientist</u> who studies prehistoric **people** by analyzing **artifacts**, inscriptions, and monuments from the past










cave paintings
